

PAIA Manual

This manual has been prepared in terms of the section 51 of the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 and to address the requirements of the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013.

2. INTRODUCTION

- 2.1. For the purpose of POPI and PAIA, MEIBC is defined as a private body. In accordance with its obligations in terms of POPI and PAIA, MEIBC has produced this manual.
- 2.2. This PAIA manual is useful for the following reasons:
 - 2.2.1. Assist with noting the nature of information that is held by the MEIBC and can be availed without submitting a formal request;
 - 2.2.2. Assists the reader to understand the process of requesting the access to records;
 - 2.2.3. Grants the reader knowledge of remedies that are available with regard to request to access to information, before approaching Courts or the Regulator.
 - 2.2.4. Describes the services available to the public from the MEIBC and how to gain access to the services.
 - 2.2.5. A description of the guide on how to use PAIA.
 - 2.2.6. Processing activities of the MEIBC, categories of data subjects and information related thereto.
 - 2.2.7. Inform the reader of any planned transfer of personal information outside the boarders of South Africa

2.3. Establishment of Metal and Engineering Industries Bargaining Council (MEIBC)

Metal and Engineering Industries Bargaining Council is a Bargaining council duly registered in terms of Section 29 of the Labour Relations Act, No. 66 of 1995, on the 11th of November 1996.

- 2.3.1. Objectives of the Council are:
 - 2.2.1.1. to consider and regulate, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, matters of mutual interest to the parties and to prevent and settle disputes;
 - 2.2.1.2. to promote good relationship between employers and employees;
 - 2.2.1.3. to use its endeavours generally in the direction of maintaining industrial peace;
 - 2.2.1.4. to secure the complete organisation of employers and employees in the Industry;
 - 2.2.1.5. to secure for employees regular employment and to minimise unemployment;

- 2.2.1.6. to administer agreements arrived at by the parties;
- 2.2.1.7. to consider, advise and make representations on any legislation or proposed legislation affecting employers and employees;
- 2.2.1.8. to consider and deal with such other matters as may affect the interests of employers and employees;
- 2.2.1.9. to establish and regulate uniform working hours and conditions of employment;
- 2.2.1.10. to secure the recognition and observance by all persons in the Industry of any agreement negotiated by the parties;
- 2.2.1.11. to receive and raise moneys by such means as the Council may, from time to time, consider advisable for the purpose of furthering the objects of the Council in the interest of employers and employees in the Industry, including the disbursement of moneys to such persons, bodies or organisations on behalf of the Council;
- 2.2.1.12. subject to Section 53(5) of the Labour Relations Act to purchase, take on lease or in exchange or otherwise acquire and sell, dispose of and otherwise deal with movable and immovable property for the Council's own needs of all kinds for the purpose of furthering the objects of the Council in the interests of employers and employees in the Industry;
- 2.2.1.13. to borrow or raise money in such manner as the Council may think fit, and in security of such money so borrowed or raised, to mortgage, pledge or charge the whole or any part of the property, assets or revenue of the Council for the purpose of furthering the objects of the Council in the interests of employers and employees in the Industry;

*Although we have used our best endeavours to supply a list of applicable legislation, it is possible that this list may be incomplete. Whenever it comes to our attention that existing or new legislation allows a Requester access on a basis other than as set out in PAIA, we shall update the list accordingly. If a Requester believes that a right of access to a record exists in terms of other legislation listed above or any other legislation, the Requester is required to indicate what legislative right the request is based on, to allow the Information Officer the opportunity of considering the request in light thereof.

8. **REQUEST PROCESS**

- 8.2. An individual who wishes to place a request must comply with all the procedures laid down in PAIA.
- 8.3. The requester must complete **ANNEXURE B**, which is attached hereto and submit it to the Information Officer at the details specified above.
- 8.4. The prescribed form must be submitted as well as payment of a request fee and a deposit, if applicable to the information officer at the postal or physical address, fax number or electronic mail as is stated herein.
- 8.5. The prescribed form must be completed with enough particularity to enable the information officer to determine:
 - 8.5.1. The record(s) requested;
 - 8.5.2. The identity of the requestor;
 - 8.5.3. What form of access is required; and
 - 8.5.4. The Postal address or fax number of the requestor.
- 8.6. The requestor must state that the records are required for the requestor to exercise or protect a right, and clearly state what the nature of the right is so to be exercised or protected. An explanation of why the records requested is required to exercise or protect the right.
- 8.7. The request for access will be dealt with within 30 days from date of receipt, unless the requestor has set out special grounds that satisfies the Information Officer that the request be dealt with sooner.
- 8.8. The period of 30 days may be extended by not more than 30 additional days, if the request is for a large quantity of information, or the request requires a search for information held at another office of MEIBC and the information cannot be reasonably obtained within 30 days. The information officer will notify the requestor in writing should an extension be necessary.
- 8.9. The Information Officer must communicate a response to the request for access using **"Annexure E"**, this communication shall inform the requestor of:
 - 8.9.1. The decision;
 - 8.9.2. Fees payable in terms of paragraph 11.

- 8.9.2.1. In the event that the Information Officer is of the opinion that the searching and preparation of the record for disclosure would amount to more than 6 hours, he/she shall inform the requestor to pay a deposit not exceeding one third of the amount payable.
- 8.10. Should the requestor have any difficulty with the form or the process laid out herein, the requestor should contact the Information Officer for assistance.
- 8.11. An oral request can be made to the Information Officer should the requestor be unable to complete the form due to illiteracy or a disability. The Information Officer will complete the form on behalf of the requestor and provide a copy of the form to the requestor.

9. GROUNDS FOR REFUSAL

- 9.2. The following are grounds upon which MEIBC may, subject to the exceptions in Chapter 4 of PAIA, refuse a request for access in accordance with Chapter 4 of PAIA:
 - 9.2.1. Mandatory protection of the privacy of a third party who is a natural person, including a deceased person, where such disclosure of Personal Information would be unreasonable.
 - 9.2.2. Mandatory protection of the commercial information of a third party, if the Records contain:
 - 9.2.2.1. Trade secrets of that third party;
 - 9.2.2.2. Financial, commercial, scientific or technical information of the third party, the disclosure of which could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of that third party; and/or
 - 9.2.2.3. Information disclosed in confidence by a third party to MEIBC, the disclosure of which could put that third party at a disadvantage in contractual or other negotiations or prejudice the third party in commercial competition;
 - 9.2.3. Mandatory protection of confidential information of third parties if it is protected in terms of any agreement;
 - 9.2.4. Mandatory protection of the safety of individuals and the protection of property;
 - 9.2.5. Mandatory protection of Records that would be regarded as privileged in legal proceedings;
 - 9.2.6. Protection of the commercial information of MEIBC, which may include: 9.2.6.1. Trade secrets;
 - 9.2.6.2. Financial/commercial, scientific or technical information, the disclosure of which could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of MEIBC;
 - 9.2.6.3. Information which, if disclosed, could put MEIBC at a disadvantage in contractual or other negotiations or prejudice MEIBC in commercial competition; and/or
 - 9.2.6.4. Computer programs which are owned by MEIBC, and which are protected by copyright and intellectual property laws;
 - 9.2.7. Research information of MEIBC or a third party, if such disclosure would place the research or the researcher at a serious disadvantage; and

9.2.8. Requests for Records that are clearly frivolous or vexatious, or which involve an unreasonable diversion of resources.

10. REMEDIES SHOULD A REQUEST BE REFUSED

- 10.2. MEIBC does not have an internal appeal procedure in light of a denial of a request, decisions made by the information officer is final.
- 10.3. The requestor may in accordance with sections 56(3) (c) and 78 of PAIA, apply to a court for relief within 180 days of notification of the decision for appropriate relief.

- 12.3. MEIBC processes personal information the following categories of Data Subjects:

 - 12.3.2. Natural persons -

- 12.4. MEIBC process the following categories personal information:

 - 12.4.6. Email addresses;

- 12.5. Recipients of Personal Information;
 - 12.5.1. MEIBC, its affiliates, their respective representatives.
 - 12.5.2. Government Institutions as may be required by any legislation.
- 12.6. When making authorised disclosures or transfers of personal information in terms of Section 72 of POPI, personal information may not be disclosed to recipients in countries that do not have the same level of protection for personal information as South Africa does.
- 12.7. The following Security measures are implemented by MEIBC:
- 12.8. MEIBC implements numerous Security measures to protect personal information that is stored electronically and physically.
 - 12.8.1. MEIBC ensures that appropriate security measures are taken and updates these measures on a regular basis.
 - 12.8.2. MEIBC have also implemented various policies for additional security for personal information stored both physically and electronically.

- 12.9. The personal information that is stored physically is protected as follows:
 - 12.9.1. Where physical records of the data exist, such records will be stored in a secure area that can be 'locked-away' as to avoid a breach of the personal information.
 - 12.9.2. Such physical data records will be 'locked-away' and secured when not in use.
- 12.10. MEIBC may share personal information with third parties and in certain instances this may result in cross border flow of the personal information. The personal information will always be subject to protection, not less than the protection it is afforded under the Protection of Personal Information Act No.4 of 2013.
- 12.11. Objection to the processing of personal information by a data subject:
 - 12.11.1. Section 11(3) of POPI and regulation 2 of the POPI regulations provides that a data subject may, at any time object to the processing of their personal information in the prescribed form attached to this manual as **ANNEXURE "C"**.
- 12.12. Request for correction or deletion of personal information:
 - 12.12.1. Section 24 of POPI and regulation 3 of the POPI regulations provides that a data subject may request for their personal information to be corrected and/or deleted in the prescribed form attached hereto as **ANNEXURE "D"**.
